Regional Executive Committee	Any adult holding an appointment in the Region, aged 18 or over, with his/her consent, may be nominated for election to the Executive Committee but not more than 6 members of the Regional Scout Council will be elected annually to the Regional Executive Committee.	By resolution of a District Scout Council or District Executive Committee or by being nominated by any four members of the RSC.	Nomination forms for election shall be available at least ninety days prior to the date fixed for the Annual General Meeting and they shall be returned to the Secretary of the Council at least sixty days prior to the date fixed for the Annual General Meeting	Where more than six valid nomination forms are received, a voting form containing the names of candidates, accompanied by such biographical details of the candidates and information about their sponsors as the Regional Executive Committee shall from time to time decide, shall be sent to members of the RSC at least thirty days prior to the date fixed for the Annual General Meeting

The Scottish Scout Council	One member of your District holding an appointment in the District, for every 250 Members and Associate Members or part thereof, based on the last Annual Census.	Either the District Commissioner or the District Scout Council's AGM.	Names are normally asked for, by SHQ in August of each year.	Nominations from Districts are in addition to those who are automatically members of Council by virtue of their role which includes District Chairmen, District Commissioners & some Regional appointments.
The Scottish Scout Council	One delegate from each District, nominated as a Youth Representative, who should be a Member or Associate Member of The Scout Association aged 18 to 25 years old.	Either the District Commissioner or the District Scout Council's AGM.	Names are normally asked for, by SHQ in August of each year.	
The Scottish Board	Any adult who holds a Scouting appointment, except those who are employed by a District or Region. The nominee must willing to accept nomination.	Any six adult members of the Association in Scotland, of whom at least one is a member of the Scottish Council.	Nominations for Scottish Board are normally requested late July/early August and have to be received at SHQ in late August/early September	No nomination shall be valid in respect of a nominee who holds a Scouting appointment in a Scout District from which an elected member of the Board is then serving on the Board, except where that member of the Board is retiring that year.
The Council of The Scout Association	Any adult holding an appointment in the Region and 1 member in the 18 – 25 age range.	Regional AGM	Normally in September of each year.	If any District has someone who would like to get involved in the work of UKHQ, please speak to the PR & Development Officer.
